Davie McLaren

Davie's first memories of the Games are from over 80 years ago when he was 7 years old. He remembers fondly the Heavy events including the Tug of War.

Davie remembers races for motorcycles on the grass track around the field, with no consideration for safety barriers to protect the public— which made for a very exciting event.

Davie recalls that the games used to have bookmakers in the field so that spectators could bet on the results of the events. Over time the book makers started using radios so that bets could also be

taken on races happening elsewhere in the country... but the book makers were always the winners in the end!

Davie is retired now, but previously he worked as a local farmer. For many years Davie was responsible for looking after the grass in the Games Field, and would be seen driving his tractor around the field to cut the grass. Since retiring Davie raised money for charity by driving his vintage tractor from Lands End to John O'Groats, and on a 1,600mile route around Scotland. Davie continues to be a strong supporter of the games and is Honorary President of the Games Committee.

Highland Fling

This dance is said to depict the actions of the stag in the rutting season. The shape of the arm and the grouping of the fingers closely resemble a deer's antlers.

Sword Dance

The ancient dance of war. It is said to date back to King Malcolm Canmore. The story relates how the king danced over the claymore of his enemy, one of MacBeth's generals crossed by his own.

Seann Truibhas

Translated as "old trousers". This dance originates in the 18th century when the wearing of the kilt was illegal. The movements of this dance depict a person in the act of shedding the dreaded "trews".

Reel of Tulloch

This dance originated in the village of Tulloch as a means of keeping warm on a cold winter's day. The dance is the most social of highland dances, the dances turning with and changing partners throughout the dance.

Sailors Hornpipe

This dance does not originate with sailors! It was originally an ancient dance common to many parts of the British Isles. Its name comes from the fact that the dance was usually accompanied by the music of the "horn pipe", a common instrument comparable to a modern flute. In time the dance became so popular with seafarers that it became known as the "sailors hornpipe". The arm movements imitate many of the actions used by sailors in the days of wooden ships.

Irish Jig

The Irish Jig danced at the Highland Games is traditional footwork and steps with the arm movements of an Irishman in a highly agitated state of mind.

Heavy Events

Events start at 11am in the Park with the Ladies and Juniors competitions. The Open competition starts at 1pm.

Throwing the Hammer

The hammer head is a spherical metal ball at the end of a wood or cane shaft. Competitors wear boots adapted with spikes and stand with their back to the direction of throw, they spin the hammer around their head 3 or 4 times before releasing. No turning of the body is permitted.

Putting the Ball

Originally large boulders, the ball is now a steel weight. The ball is thrown from one hand in a single movement.

Weight for Distance

The weight is a cast weight attached to a chain and handle. The competitor holds the weight with one hand and makes 3 turns before releasing the handle.

Weight over the Bar

Again, this event was originally with boulders, but now uses steel weights. The weight is swung single handed between the competitors legs and then up over the bar.

Tossing the Caber

The objective is to toss the caber end over end so that it lies directly in front of the thrower facing 12Noon on a clock face. There is no standard weight or size for the caber, the only rule is that “only the best of competitors should be able to turn it”!

Running events are run on a handicapped basis with every competitor allocated a handicap rating based on previous performance. This can lead to a tight finish with the runners crossing the line close together.

Cycling

The cycle races are around the same grass track used by the runners. The bicycles are fixed wheel (fixed-gear) with no brakes, the cyclists' shoes are clipped into pedals so if the wheels are turning so must their legs.

Jumping

The Blackford games have long jump, high jump, and triple jump.

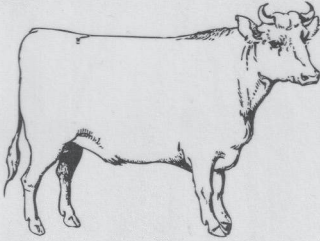

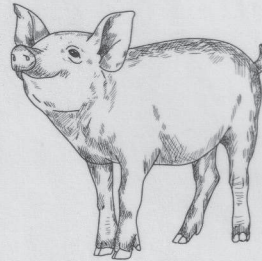

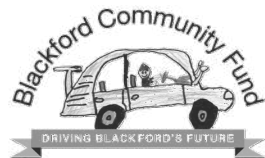
